Barbara Young, who did a great job with publicity. Many visitors enjoyed the sale and visiting the Jansen for the first time. Workshop students came from far and wide, including Montana and Canada.

Susan Clueit, who was there from beginning helping the jurors, storing all the juried products prior to the sale and at the end of the day, reconciling the sales.

Many volunteers helped make this event a success, more than I can mention here. Again, thank you one and all.





News for Program Chairs: "Peruvian Textiles in a Box" Coming in 2018


